Great News for Our Rural Communities! We're thrilled to share that the Farming Life Centre has been awarded £20,000 to support our Rural Befriending Project from the National Lottery Community Fund

Digital Inclusion Project Update Get Connected with Confidence



The Farming Life Centre has successfully utilized digital platforms to assist farming communities in Derbyshire. These efforts enhance social engagement, improve communication, promote resilience, and boost digital inclusion—connecting community well-being and support through technology.

Drop-in Sessions at Castleton Village Hall have been held during October and November. These sessions provided practical help for residents with tasks like: setting up email accounts, accessing online healthcare services, navigating social media safely, exploring and understanding Excel Spreadsheets and getting the most out of your mobile phone.

Members of the Farming Life Centre team were on hand throughout these sessions, offering one-toone guidance and troubleshooting for digital devices. They also helped signpost people to further resources and training opportunities.

Impact:

- Increased confidence among attendees in using digital tools.
- Strengthened community engagement by reducing barriers to online services.
- Positive feedback from participants who appreciated the friendly, patient support.

BIRD FLU ALERT

Poultry and captive bird housing measures are in place in England

Reminder: Housing measures to protect poultry & captive birds from #AvianInfluenza are now in place across the whole of England.

This means it is now a legal requirement for all keepers in England with over 50 birds or keepers of fewer than 50 birds who sell or give away eggs, meat or poultry to house their birds and follow stringent biosecurity measures. Keeping your birds undercover away from wild birds is vital to minimise the risk of them becoming infected with avian influenza by wild birds.

It remains essential that you follow strict biosecurity measures to reduce the risk of disease spreading to your birds.

An Avian Influenza Prevention Zone (AIPZ) with mandatory biosecurity measures is also in force across Great Britain.

A one-year extension is being offered to more than 5,000 Countryside Stewardship Mid Tier (CS MT) agreement holders whose agreements are set to expire on 31 December this year. This targeted, time-limited extension is being offered while the reformed Sustainable **Farming** Incentive for 2026 developed, is Environmental Improvement Plan is refreshed and the new Countryside Stewardship Higher Tier scheme is rolled out.

About the extension

The extension will move the end date of your agreement to a later point – in this case, to 31 December 2026. You'll continue under the same rules, terms and conditions as your existing CS MT agreement.

Please note:

- you cannot use an extension to add, remove or replace options or capital items in an existing agreement.
- any capital works that haven't been completed and paid for by the time the extension starts will be removed from the agreement.
- options and supplements with a duration of less than 5 years cannot be extended.

What you need to do

The Rural Payments Agency (RPA) will contact you within the next few weeks if your CS MT agreement is eligible for an extension. If you want an extension, you must reply to the offer by 27 November 2025. Your agreement and payments will then continue after 31 December 2025. If you do not want to continue with your agreement, or cannot meet the conditions of the extension, let the RPA know. If you do not reply to your extension offer by 27 November 2025, you will not be able to extend your agreement, and it will end on 31 December 2025. If you have not heard from the RPA by 6 November and have a CS MT agreement expiring in December 2025, you can call the RPA to check.
